As the French culture is very polite and courteous, going through the ritual of greeting another person is an important way of showing respect. When you meet a French, you can greet them in three ways:

Shake hands-done with strangers,

Kiss on the cheek - used with friends and family members

Bonjour – can be used with anyone throughout the day.

Comment Saluer? How to greet in French?

There are **two** ways of greeting in French – Formal and Informal. Formal way is used when we are talking to people who are elder to us or are mere acquaintances whereas the informal conversation is used when we are talking to people younger to us or are of our age.

Pierre: Salut Marc! Comment Ça va?

Marc: Salut Pierre! Ça va bien, merci

Translations:

Pierre: Hi Marc! How are you?

Marc: Hi Peter! I am fine, thank you.

A: Ça va.

II. Conversation Formelle:

A: Bonjour Monsieur! Comment –allez vous?

B: Bonjour Madame! Je vais bien, merci beaucoup.

Translation:

A: Good day sir! How are you?

B: Good day ma'am! I am fine. Thanks a lot

Ça va can be replied in many ways on depending how are you feeling
If you are feeling great- Ça va très bien!
If you are feeling just fine- Ça va!
If you are feeling same ole same ole- Comment çi, comment ça!
If you are feeling bad- Ça va mal.
Pour prendre congé, nous disons : When we take leave of someone , we say
A: Au revoir/ À bientôt, À demain!
B: Au revoir, À bientôt, À demain! (Bye, See You soon!, See you tomorrow)
